Workshop objectives

Earth Day, celebrated worldwide since 1970, is considered to be the day when the movement to protect the environment was born. Every year on April 22, more than one billion people take part in Earth Day. Across the globe, individuals, communities, organizations, and governments acknowledge the amazing planet we call home and take action to protect it.

Climate change is a global concern that has already resulted in extreme weather conditions not experienced sometimes for more than one hundred years. “Changing with the Climate - CwC” is an educational network that links schools across Europe to enhance teaching and learning and to encourage positive action in response to climate change.

The global aim of CwC partnership is to understand the linkage between lifestyle and energy use and how this can result in a changing climate locally. Then to explore the options for introducing renewable energy sources locally to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels and the associated greenhouse gases that they emit.

During the workshop, it will be presented the experiences of using resources on a Romanian wide basis and to consider how such information and knowledge can be disseminated to help limit climate change.

Two Romanian champion schools in environmental activities will be selected to present their case studies during the Final European network event that will be held in Szentendre, Hungary on September 10-11, 2013.
